At Idsall School we aim to:

- Be a school where students work hard to achieve their maximum potential

- Offer students activities and opportunities that develop a sense of self-worth, healthy well-being, enjoyment and belonging

At Idsall School we will not accept:

- Bullying in any form
- Behaviour that hinders the learning of others

At Idsall School we expect you to:

1. Be punctual to all lessons and to enter the classroom in a sensible and mature manner. Eating, drinking and chewing in lessons are not allowed
2. Bring the correct equipment to all lessons
3. Make sure that you are properly dressed in the school uniform. Remember that the only jewellery that you may wear to school is a wrist watch and one pair of plain stud earrings (one stud only in each ear)
4. Follow instructions given to you immediately and without question
5. If you wish to ask or answer a question, put up your hand – do not call out or speak over someone else
6. Behave appropriately in class and not distract others from working
7. Be polite and respectful to your teachers and to your classmates. Address members of staff as, “Sir” or “Miss” or by name
8. Concentrate fully on the tasks set and complete all my work to the best of your ability
9. Respect your environment. Do not drop litter or mark your books or your desk with graffiti

• When you are moving around the school:

Walk on the left hand side of the corridor in a quiet and sensible manner. Do not run or jump down steps. Do not shout or call out to friends. Remember that some behaviour is offensive to others – particularly bad language and public overfamiliarity.

• On the way to and from school:

Your behaviour and manners should be of the same standard as when you are here. Always be polite to local people. Do not drop litter. Respect other people’s property. If you travel on the bus you should show the driver the same respect that you would to a member of staff. Stay in your seat. Do not leave a mess behind for the driver to clear up.

• If you are away from school:

Your parent or guardian should phone the school attendance office to let them know that you will not be coming in to school and on your first day back you should bring a note from home to explain your absence to your form tutor.

If you need to miss a lesson for a match or a school trip, you will need signed permission from the teachers who would be taking the lessons you are asking to miss.
