

IDSALL SCHOOL UNIFORM – SEPTEMBER 2017

- Girls** White shirt (full or short sleeve - not $\frac{3}{4}$), with school tie fully striped
Years 7 -10 – Dark Green Skirt OR plain black school trousers – (see guideline below)
Year 11 – Black skirt OR plain black school trousers (see guideline overleaf)
Plain dark green, black or white socks – not patterned
Plain dark green, black or brown tights – not patterned
Plain black or dark brown flat heeled shoes (**not trainers**) (see guideline overleaf)
Black blazer (with black lining) and school badge

UNIFORM GUIDELINES – the expected standard at Idsall School

- Skirts must be appropriate for work in terms of material, style and length. Skirts should be straight and not tightly tailored or of a stretchy 'lycra' type material. Skirts must be worn **on the knee** and not of high waisted style. Splits should be of an appropriate length for school.
- Shirts must be plain without emblems or badges – patterned t-shirts or polo necks must not be worn under shirts.
- School trousers should be plain black, loose fitting with a straight leg with a front fastening. They should have a single button at the waist and a concealed zip. We do not allow low cut

'hipster' style trousers or broad, decorative belts. Jean-style/stretch or denim fabrics are not acceptable – an entirely appropriate school trouser is available from our supplier.

- Outdoor coats or jackets should be of a plain, **dark** colour without bold words or logos and with a front fastening. We do not allow pullover tops, 'hoodies' or cardigans, they may be confiscated during the school day. Scarves are for outdoor wear only and not to be worn inside the school building.
- **Pupils may wear fluorescent arm or shoulder bands for road safety on the way to and from school in the winter months.**
- Shoes – we will not allow high, narrow heels (heels higher than 2 inches), sling backs, mules or other shoes that we judge to be unsuitable for school. Trainers of any type or style are not acceptable and shoes made of a canvas material (e.g. pumps) are not permitted.
- Jewellery – This is limited to a watch and plain ear studs, one in each ear. Rings, necklaces or other jewellery items are liable to be confiscated for a period of time. Any other kind of body piercing is not permitted.
- **Discreet** make-up is a privilege for girls in Years 10 and 11. Students in KS3 will be asked to remove make-up. Nail varnish is not allowed in any year. False nails of any type are not allowed and nails should be a suitable length for school.
- Unnatural hair colours, unconventional styles or extreme cuts (under Grade 2) are not allowed. This includes cut patterns or designs in the hair. Parents should be aware that students can be taken out of lessons whilst hair grows back from unconventional styles or extreme cuts and in some cases having unnatural dyed hair may lead to an exclusion. Hair should not cover the eyes. We suggest that parents talk to their Year Leader before arranging 'special' hairstyling for their children. Facial hair is not acceptable in Key Stages 3 or 4. Hair bands are to be black or brown in colour, other fashion hair accessories are not acceptable.

AN ACCEPTABLE SCHOOL SHOE



These types of shoe conform with the school Uniform Policy. Velcro, slip on or lace up are acceptable if they have a formal appearance and **do not** have a trainer style sole.

NOT AN ACCEPTABLE SCHOOL SHOE



These are trainer type shoes with a trainer sole and therefore **do not** conform with the school policy.
