
# Half Term and PD Day




## Ever wanted to be part of a show .... now is your chance!

When Ren and his mother move from Chicago to a small farming town, he is prepared for the inevitable adjustment period at his new high school. But he's not prepared for the rigorous local edicts, including a ban on dancing (and in turn any popular music considered immoral) instituted by the local preacher, who is determined to exercise control over the town's youth. When the reverend's rebellious daughter sets her sights on Ren, her roughneck boyfriend tries to sabotage Ren's reputation, with many of the locals eager to believe the worst about the new kid. The heartfelt story that emerges pins a father longing for the son he lost against a young man aching for the father who walked out on him.

STAGE AGE: 18-25 VOCAL PART: TENOR PRESENTING GENDER: MALE Friend of WULLARD. Cowboy hat, boots and an attitude. Thinks of himself as the only "real man" in the room. (Sings Still Rockin).

LULU WARNICKER Stage Age: 35-45 Ren's Aunt, married to WES. Multiple lines, a part of church choir

WES WARNICKER Stage Age: 35-45 Wes's Aunt, married to LULU. Multiple lines, a part of church choir

Audition information

You will be required to perform one song and one monologue of your choice from the options below. Auditions will not be based on the actors preferred character (for example, you won't be able to audition specifically for the role of Ren). Instead, roles will be assigned based on the audition process.

Auditions will take place after school on Monday 4<sup>th</sup> November and Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> November afterschool in D1 (Drama studio). It is **your** responsibility to go to finance and book/ pay £1.50 for the late bus, if you require it.

Rehearsal schedules will be on display in Drama and Music and if given a role following a successful audition, attendance will be compulsory. Failure to attend 3 rehearsals without an valid reason (approved in advance – with the exception of school absence - by Mrs Creighton) will result in your role being re-cast.

Rehearsals will take place on a Monday (acting) and Tuesday (dance) afterschool in D1. Mr Austin will contact cast separately regarding singing/music rehearsals.

### Chorus/ensemble and back stage roles

If you would like a role in the chorus (a mixture of singing, dancing and a little acting), you do not need to audition. Simply turn up to rehearsals.






























# Disneyland Paris - Year 7 & 8

On Thursday 17th October 2024, we held the Great Idsall Bake Off in aid of Breast Cancer, a charity that is close to a number of families at Idsall.


Baked goods and tasty treats were sold at break and lunch in the main hall , and all the money raised will be donated to Cancer Research.





# Topology


Some of our year 8 students have been using Play-Doh and pasta to make network topologies in Computing.

## **Child Exploitation in Shropshire**

Are you concerned about changes in your child's behaviour?

Have you noticed that they may be feeling under pressure from influences from outside your family home?

Realising that your child could be being exploited can be distressing, but help and support is available.



#### What is Exploitation?

Are you concerned about changes in your child's behaviour? Have you noticed that they may be feeling under pressure from influences from outside your family home? Realising that your child could be being exploited can be distressing, but help and support is available.

Exploitation is a form of abuse, it occurs where an individual or group takes advantage of an imbalance of power to coerce, manipulate or deceive a child, young person or adult into any activity that results in an advantage for the perpetrator. Specific types of Exploitation include Sexual Exploitation, Criminal Exploitation, and Financial Exploitation.

#### Who does it affect?

Exploitation can happen to any young person from any background, in any part of the country - including Shropshire. The young person often isn't aware that they are a victim, as exploiters are very clever in the way they manipulate the young person into trusting them.

Between April 2020 - April 2021, Shropshire Children's Services received 361 referrals for young people believed to have been either exploited, targeted or vulnerable. These numbers continue to rise.

#### What are the signs?

- New friendship groups, who may be older in age
- Engaging in sexual activity, including exchanging indecent photos
- Missing episodes, when you don't know their whereabouts
- Receiving gifts & rewards, including drugs, alcohol, food & clothing
- Increased secretiveness, particularly around phone use
- Disengagement from school, hobbies & family
- Use of drugs or alcohol, perhaps without the means to afford this
- A decline in mental health, possibly becoming more aggressive
- Possession of a weapon, and/or committing low level crimes

### What can I do as a parent or carer?

- Discuss differences between healthy and unhealthy friendships and relationships
- ☑ Stay alert to any changes in behaviour which may indicate that they are feeling under pressure
- Carefully monitor any episodes of staying out late or not returning home
- Be aware of who they are spending time with and encourage them to keep in touch by texting you when they are out in the community
- Call the police to report your child missing if you do not know where they are
- Talk openly to your child about keeping safe and listen calmly if they confide in you
- Regularly check the young person's possessions for drugs and any unexplained money or gifts
- Install online safety features and apps
- ☑ Check in with parents of their friends
- Be cautious of any older friends or friendships where there appears to be a power imbalance
   Check in with school or college to see if they
- Check in with school or college to see if they have noticed any changes in behaviour


